# Taylor Road Baptist Re-Entry Plan

## Worship Service Schedule

- Saturday's at 6:30pm - Parking Lot Worship
- Sunday Morning at 8:30am - Student Center
- Sunday Morning at 10:30am - Worship Center

## Worship Service Procedures (for both indoor worship services)

- Student Center Worship will be capped at 75 individuals.
- Worship Center Worship will be capped at 150 individuals.
- Attendees will be asked to register in advance at [www.taylorroad.org/worship](http://www.taylorroad.org/worship).
- ***Anyone not feeling well, running a fever, or with a compromised immune system is asked to stay home.***
- Masks are encouraged but not required (at this time). Masks will be provided for those who don't have a personal one.
- Social distancing (6ft) is to be maintained.
- No handshaking, hugging, or close personal contact.
- Offerings will be deposited in marked bins at the conclusion of the worship service.
- Bathrooms are available but discouraged.

# Taylor Road Baptist Re-Entry Plan

## **Student Center Worship Service (specific guidelines)**

- Attendees are asked to use the Building A office doors, west entrance doors, and/or student center doors.
- Building A bathrooms are available but discouraged.
- Chairs will be grouped in groups of 5 and distanced 6ft apart.
- Families are asked to sit together.
- Access to the nursery and preschool hall is not permitted.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be available in the Student Center.

## **Worship Center Worship Service (specific guidelines)**

- Attendees are asked to use the glass doors in foyer of Building B or the East Entrance of Building C.
- Building B bathrooms are available but discouraged.
- Every other row will be used for seating.
- The balcony will be closed.
- Families are asked to sit together and a minimum of 3 seats are to remain empty between families.
- Access to Building A, upstairs of Building B, and Children's Hall, 2nd & 3rd floors of Building C is not permitted.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be available in the front lobby of Building B.

# **Some Frequently Asked Questions (answered by Pastor Daniel)**

## **When will we resume Sunday morning small groups and Wednesday night activities?**

Well, to be honest, we don't quite know the answer to that just yet. The biggest issue we're facing when it comes to campus-wide small groups and Wednesday night activities is how we properly sanitize following these activities. We have a large campus and the more we spread out the harder it will be to clean in the ways we would need to clean.

On another note, we do not feel that it is wise to resume children's activities at this point and that would greatly affect many of our families.

Again, I'm asking you to be patient. We are taking baby steps - not leaps and bounds.

## **What about Children & Youth ministries?**

First of all I'd like to say a HUGE word of "thanks" to Clint Bryant, Stephanie Holmes and all of our student and children's teachers. So many of them have worked so hard at continuing their ministry to our young people and have pushed themselves out of their comfort zones to learn new technology in order to stay connected.

First, let me speak about our preschool and children's ministries. Our Children's Ministry Director, Stephanie Holmes, is currently working with a committee to help her make safe and smart decisions in preparation for when children's ministry activities resume. As of right now, we do not have a set-in-stone date but will be watching our school system and will consult with sister churches in their decision making.

# Some Frequently Asked Questions (answered by Pastor Daniel)

## Children & Students continued...

One of the biggest “hits” our children’s ministry is taking this summer is Vacation Bible School. Stephanie is currently working with her team to come up with a plan to safely do a customized VBS later this year.

Our students are, obviously, also missing their gatherings. Clint and many of his student developers have done a phenomenal job staying connected with our students and their families.

Pastor Clint is working on the possibility of some outdoor activities for our students later in the summer as well as a possible customized camp for them in July.

## What if we’re not comfortable coming indoors for worship?

One of the things we, as a ministry staff, have learned and greatly value is the importance of our online worship. We’ve also been blown away by the attendance at our drive-in worship services. We completely understand that everyone is dealing with the effects of this virus differently and not everyone shares the same concerns (or lack of).

We remain committed to acting in love and making sure everyone can participate in corporate worship. We will continue - for the foreseeable future - our Saturday evening drive-in service as well as our online worship. In fact, we’ve taken an extra step in live-streaming our outdoor worship service so that those at home can feel like they’re a part of our corporate worship experience.
